The Pin gives everyday
Australians the opportunity to recognise veterans and thank them for their service while the card gives the business community the opportunity to show its thanks by way of discounts. The new-look card is a redesign of the existing DVA health cards (Gold, White and Orange). There are no changes to DVA services or entitlements.



Veterans and Reservists can now apply for the Covenant, including the Veteran Card, Lapel Pin and Oath, online using <a href="MyService">MyService</a> or by calling DVA. Depending on your type of service, you may be eligible for all, or some, of the Covenant items. These items will be sent in the mail, noting that the Lapel Pin and Oath will be sent separately to the Veteran Card. If you require assistance, please contact the Sub Branch.
